2. WHY PRAY?	28
<p>(1) Because God insistently commands it in the Bible. (2) Because prayer is God's appointed way for Christians to get things. (3) Because prayer is God's way for Christians to have fullness of joy. (4) Because prayer is the way out of all trouble, the cure for all worry and anxious care. (5) Because answered prayer is the only unanswerable argument against skepticism, unbelief, modernism and infidelity. (6) Because prayer is the only way to have the power of the Holy Spirit for God's work. (7) Because "whosoever shall call upon the name of the Lord shall be saved."</p>	
3. PRAYER IS ASKING	46
<p>(1) Prayer is not praise, adoration, meditation, humiliation nor confession, but asking. (2) Bible prayers were asking. (3) Hypocrisy is so-called praying that does not ask for something.</p>	

4. THE ANSWER TO PRAYER IS RECEIVING 56
 (1) The Scriptures teach that an answer to prayer is getting what you asked for. (2) How to pray in the will of God for a "yes" answer.
